



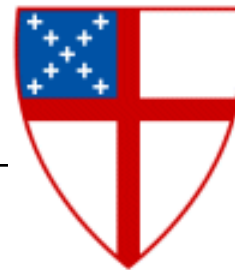

### Ramblings from the Rector

We have a deacon! On Sunday, June 26, 2011 the Reverend Dianna LaMance Deaderick, our former diaconal intern, returned to St. Luke's to begin her ministry among us as Deacon.

We explored the role or function and ministry of the deacon on Trinity Sunday, June 19, 2011. I remarked, "The primary focus of the Diaconate is ministry **beyond** the walls of the Church."

Deacon Deaderick and I recently met to discuss the deacon's ministry and role at St. Luke's, resulting in the following:

- to facilitate, support and develop programs and projects related to the ministry of the Commission on Community & Human Resources;
- to collaborate with the Commission on Spiritual Life with the development, implementation and support for studies, quiet days, retreats and other formation events;
- to reestablish the HIV/AIDS ministry with St. Luke's and the Columbia community using resources from Allen University, Benedict College, the SC AIDS Council, and the Palmetto Aids Life Support Services (PALSS);
- to research the possibility of establishing a homework center for local elementary school children using students from Allen University and Benedict College;
- to increase the visibility of St. Luke's Parish within the Greater Columbia Area by providing alternative opportunities for worship and outreach for all people;
- to serve as deacon and assist with worship services on Sundays and other days/occasions, including preaching;
- to assist the rector with pastoral care and services, as (the deacon's) time and availability permit;
- to collaborate with the rector and vestry on all projects, programs and other areas as assigned and negotiated.

At the Liturgy or Mass, the deacon reads the Holy Gospel, shares in the preaching, leads the Prayers of the People, calls us to Confession of our Sins, prepares the table (the Altar) for Communion and assists with the administering of Holy Communion. Finally, the deacon sends us forth into the world to love and serve.

To further understand the role, ministry and function of the deacon, I invite you to read through the Liturgy for the Ordination of a Deacon, page 537 of the Book of Common Prayer. Compare it with the Liturgy for the Ordination of a Priest, page 525 of the Book of Common Prayer

Do join me in welcoming the Reverend Dianna LaMance Deaderick to St. Luke's Church.

## MEMBER PROFILE - ALICE WYCHE HURLEY

In June 2011, Mrs. Alice Wyche Hurley was honored and presented the "Leadership in Diversity" Award by the Sisters of Charity Foundation of South Carolina. The award was presented to her by the foundation to recognize her exemplary performance in the area of diversity and inclusion. The award recognizes her accomplishments of community engagement, awareness, bridge building, compassionate leadership and courageous advocacy. Mrs. Hurley is the first recipient of the "Leadership in Diversity" Award. She has served as a member of the Sisters of Charity Foundation Board of Trustees from 2001 through 2010.

Alice is a graduate of Boston University and received her Masters in Social Work degree from Atlanta University. In 1967, she started working in Richland School District One, where she worked as a social worker and retired as the Coordinator of School Social Workers. Through her work as a psychiatric social worker and a school social worker, she has worked with thousands of children and adults.

Mrs. Hurley works with her husband, Anthony (Tony) Hurley in their family business, Manigault-Hurley Funeral Home, a long standing and successful business in Columbia, SC. She is a published writer and co-author of many articles which have appeared in the Journal of American Medicine and the National Journal for Education and Psychology.

She and Tony have pioneered many projects in this community including co-founding the Columbia Urban League and the Poinsettia Cotillion. The Columbia Urban League recently recognized them for their achievement and years of service to the community. In 1996, Mr. and Mrs. Hurley were the recipients of the Order of the Palmetto, which is South Carolina's highest honor presented by the Governor. They were the first couple to share this honor.

Other awards that Alice has received are the Southern School Social Worker of the Year (1996); Pioneer of the Year from USC School of Social Work (2003); and the Girls Scouts Women of Distinction Award (1997).

She has been active on many boards, served on many committees, and participated in many organizations. A few of those organizations are the Columbia Chapter of Links, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, and the Columbia Chapter of the National Smart Set.

Alice is a member of St. Luke's Episcopal Church and has been a faithful participant for years in many of our church organizations. She especially enjoys singing on the choir and serving as a lector and chalice bearer. Quarterly, she coordinates the assignments for the lectors, intercessors and the chalice bearers. In what she does she shows that she is a woman of faith.

This year Alice and Tony will be celebrating their 50th wedding anniversary. She and Tony have 3 grown children, Bryan, Kelly, and Michelle; and 5 grandchildren. Alice's grandchildren are her pride and joy.

After the liturgy, everyone had the opportunity to greet the new deacons in the Parish Hall.

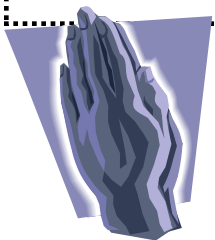
## **REACHING People With Arthritis And Other Chronic Health Condition**

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates that more than 50 million American adults have doctor-diagnosed arthritis with the number expected to grow as the population ages. Arthritis is the most common cause of disability in the country, and managing it can be complex and frustrating for both patient and health care provider. Current clinical practice guidelines for arthritis emphasize the use of non-pharmacological treatments such as self-management education and physical activity interventions. The CDC Arthritis Program has identified evidence-based, interventions that have been proven effective for reducing symptoms and improving the quality of life. These programs are being offered in the community.
